Redding, Conn., April 22.—Samuel L. Clemens (Mark Twain) died here late yesterday of heart trouble and a complication of ills. For years Mr. Clemens has occupied a foremost place in American literature and will have a lasting international reputation. Since he brought forth "Tom Sawyer," and "An Innocent Abroad," before the public he was recognized as one of the greatest American humorists and story tellers. A former Mississippi river steamboat pilot, he adopted the boating term, "Mark Twain," as his pen name. He was about seventy-five years old and but recently finished an autobiography of himself.
