JULY RACE PROGRAMME

Interesting List of Events to Take Place at Marshfield, Oregon, July 1-2-3-4-5.

The Coos County Racing Association has given out the following program of its July race meet.

FIRST DAY, FRIDAY, JULY 1st.

No. 1—Running 5-8 mile dash, purse..... \$125 00

No. 2—Trotting and pacing 3/4 mile heats, 2:30 class, best two out of three, purse..... 100 00

Race No. 3—Half-mile Burro race, purse..... 5 00

No. 4—100-yard foot race, (medals for first and second places.)

No. 5—Running 3/4 mile dash, for horses owned and kept in Coos and Curry counties since Jan. 1, 1910, catch weights, purse... 75 00

No. 5 1/2—Running broad jump (medals for 1st and 2d places.)

No. 6—Relay race for saddle horses of eight miles. The relay race is to cover four days, two miles are to be run each day, riders to change horses every half mile. The winner will be declared the 4th day. Purse..... 100 00

SECOND DAY, SATURDAY, JULY 2.

No. 7—3/4-mile dash, purse..... 175 00

No. 8—Pacing and trotting, 3/4 mile heats, for 2:15 class, best 2 out of 3, purse..... 150 00

No. 9—420 yard foot race (medals for 1st and 2d places.)

No. 10—Burro race, 3/4-mile dash to harness, purse..... 5 00

No. 10 1/2—Running high jump, (medals for 1st and 2nd places.)

No. 11—1/2-mile dash, catch weights, for horses not trained this season, purse..... 20 00

No. 12—Running 3/4-mile. Owners handicapped for horses kept and owned in Coos county since Jan. 1, '10, purse..... 125 00

No. 13—Relay race (same as No. 6.)

THIRD DAY, SUNDAY, JULY 3d.

No. 14—Running 1/2-mile dash for horses owned and kept in Coos and Douglas counties since Jan. 1, '10, catch weight, purse 100 00

No. 15—Free-for-all, trotting and pacing, 3/4-mile, best three out of five, purse..... 175 00

No. 16—220-yard hurdle race (medals for 1st and 2d places.)

No. 16 1/2—100 yard dash (medals for 1st and 2d places.)

No. 17—Running, one mile dash Purse..... 175 00

No. 18—Relay race (same No. 6.)

FOURTH DAY, MONDAY, JULY 4th.

No. 19—Running 3/4-mile dash, for horses owned and kept in Coos county, since Jan. 1, '10. Catch weights, purse..... 100 00

No. 19 1/2—440-yd foot race (medals for 1st and 2d places.)

No. 20—Trotting and pacing 1-mile heats, best 3 in 5, free for all, purse..... 250 00

No. 20 1/2—pole vault (medals for 1st and 2d places.)

No. 21—Running 3/4-mile catch weights, horses not trained this season, purse..... 30 00

No. 21 1/2—1/2-mile relay race, silver trophy.

No. 22—Running 1 mile dash, purse..... 200 00

No. 23—Relay (same as No. 6.)

FIFTH DAY, TUESDAY, JULY 5th.

No. 24—Running 3/4-mile consolation for losers not winning any money at this meeting, purse..... 100 00

No. 25—Running 3/4-mile match race between Cardwell's King Kohr and Seeley's McBeth.

No. 28—Automobile race.

In all races, entrance fee 10 per cent of the amount of purse deducted from first and second money winners. Money divided 60 per cent first horse, 30 per cent second horse and 10 per cent third horse. Weights, 10 pounds below scale, unless otherwise stated.

Entries close at the fair grounds 12 o'clock noon the day before race, with Racing Secretary G. W. Carleton.

All athletic events shall be conducted under the Amateur Association Rules. None but amateurs under 21 years of age shall be eligible to compete in any event, excepting race No. 4. This race is open to persons of any age who are amateurs. Race No. 16 1/2 is open to bona fide High school or Grade students only.

All entries for athletic events close at 12 o'clock noon the day before the event. Athletic entries free.

Races start at 2 o'clock p. m. sharp, each day.

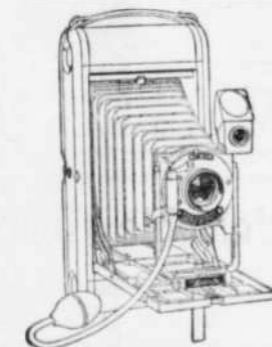
