Spread of the Orange Grove.

In four decades, Southern California has been transformed from a land of catule ranges to one of oranges. In a third of a century the citrus industry has grown from a single earload shipment to thirty-eight thousand. Of the twenty million boxes of oranges annually consumed in the United States, California supplies twelve million five hundred thousand. The receipts from the citrus crop for season of 1908-9 were over \$30,000,000.—J. M. Quinn, in the October Pacific Monthly.
