

# DAIRY MEETING JANUARY 11TH

Having been sent as a delegate to the State Dairy Association by the dairy-men of the Coquille it seems wise to the writer to make a brief report through the press before the meeting becomes too much a thing of past history.

The meeting was a good one. The representation from all parts of the state was very satisfactory, excepting from our section. Being the one-line delegate from Southwestern Oregon it behooves me to tell the tale.

It appears there has been a decline in the total amount of dairy products put forth from the state, although higher prices brought the financial returns about up to the average.

Bovine tuberculosis was the topic which attracted the most attention at the convention. Some six months ago the City of Portland passed a drastic ordinance regulating the sale of milk within that municipality. Among other requirements was one, that cows should be tested for tuberculosis by the tuberculin test. This ordinance was found to conflict in certain points with the state constitution but will soon be amended so as to become effective. But the point is that the testing done previous to this law being declared unconstitutional showed a very serious situation in the vicinity of Portland. It is estimated that about 38 per cent of the dairy cows in the immediate vicinity of that city are infected. About 1,400 were slaughtered as a result of the investigation. So far as examination has been made in other parts of the state the indication is that the infection is very slight, running from 1 to 5 per cent.

The result of these investigations and the publicity given them by the Portland press has been to create a public sentiment which will certainly result in some kind of legislation. Hence the State Dairy association, after debating and considering many propositions, put itself on record as favoring a law which should: first, give the state veterinarian power to compel a cattle owner to submit his herd to the tuberculin test when the circumstances justify it; second, make it a principle for a cattle owner to have his herd tested at his own option by the proper officials; third, provide a reasonable compensation to cattle owners for all cattle ordered to be slaughtered, half to be paid by the state and half by the county in which the case occurred.

The same resolution was adopted by the State Butter and Cheese Makers' association and will be enforced by the Pure-bred Livestock Association. This puts the dairymen, the dairy manufacturers and the stock breeders solidly behind one line of legislation.

Butter dairymen give this proposed legislation your earnest consideration. It will come up for endorsement at the next meeting of the Dairy Association to be held at Coquille, the second Wednesday in January. At that time it will also employ this report.

IN THE CIRCUIT COURT OF THE STATE OF OREGON FOR COOS COUNTY.
