CITY HALL TO BE BUILT

The city council met Monday evening, with Mayor Morrison, Recorder Lawrence, Councilmen True, Pierce, Laird, Leach, Lyons and Skeels, and Marshal Evernden present.

A resolution was passed instructing the recorder to give notice for the collection of assessments for the improvement of Spurgon street and the sewer on First street.

Another resolution passed declaring the sewer on B street completed and accepted.

The matter of the Moulton street bridge, which is out of order, was referred to the street committee and city engineer, with power to act as was also the matter of approach and street to the recently completed city wharf.

In the matter of the Home Telephone company's bill for \$11.65, it was allowed with the condition that the same be paid when the pole and guy wires, near the recorder's office, shall be removed by the company. The vote stood—Skeels, Leach and Pierce, aye; Laird, Lyons and True, no, the mayor breaking the tie by voting aye.

Adjournment was taken to 7:30 Wednesday evening.

At the meeting of the council Wednesday evening a motion was made by Laird, seconded by True, that proceedings be made to build city hall. The motion was carried by unanimous vote.

Adjourned to 7:30 tonight at which time an ordinance will doubtless be presented embodying all matters requisite for building the city hall, at an early date.
