#### CURRY COUNTY

Superintendent Guerin, who has been suffering severely for several weeks past from an old affliction of the tongue, is recovering his former health.

Miners, fishermen, hunters and campers are quite numerous on the Sixes. They are all wearing a pleasant smile which would seem to indicate happiness and prosperity.

The grand jury has found a number of indictments against northern Curry parties for gambling, selling whiskey, etc., and among the indicted are both the saloon keepers at Langlois.

F. M. Langlois of Gold Beach is the owner of a jersey cow from which he realized \$23.60 for the month of June last and this, aside from furnishing his family of three with milk and butter. Curry county is well adapted to dairying.

Liquor men of Curry county, at the recent term of court, were made to pay fines aggregating over \$1,000 for violating the liquor laws. Will Prince, a grand juror from Gold Beach, conducts a licensed saloon and helped indict himself on account of selling liquor on Sundays. He pleaded guilty and was fined \$15 and costs, the law limiting fines for this offense to from \$10 to \$25. Others were more heavily fined for selling to minors and permitting gambling.

Forester Milbury informs the Port Orford Tribune that he has about \$800 government money to spend at once in extending the Elk river trail from Elwoods mine up Panther creek avoiding Bald Mountain entirely and shortening the distance to Big Bend by a much better route. Supervisor Marsh has been making some substantial improvements on the roads in this district. The road has been straightened and a fill made at Elk river bridge; the Widowville bridge has been replanked and the old planking hauled to Hubbard's creek where it has been used on the sand there.
