### GET THE FARMER (Marshfield Record)

C. A. Smith, the lumberman who has done so much for Coos and who left the City to-day, makes some excellent suggestions regarding the settlement of Coos County. Mr. Smith says without reserve that a good farmer can make a better living and more money on forty acres of land in Coos county than he could on one hundred and sixty acres of land in Iowa which would cost \$150 an acre to buy. Mr. Smith says that if the people of the east only knew of the climatic and soil conditions of Coos county which are so favorable to agriculture that they would flock to this section rather than settle in the Northern States where they most battle with long winters and endeavor to make a living off of land not half so productive as is found in this locality.

The suggestion of Mr. Smith is one which should be followed out. What this county needs is people. Not merely transients who will spend a few dollars, but people who will come here to live and settle on the land and make the place their home. The advantages which Coos county presents to farmers should be made known to the whole country. While we are advertising the locality we should tell the man of moderate means that he can come here with his family and make a good living and become independent. Some say that the land is all taken up. That is a mistake. While the amount of money paid to ranchers of Coos county for milk is \$500,000 a year the best of authorities will tell you that there is room in the Coquille valley alone for ten times as much dairying as is now carried

on. Mr. Smith's suggestion is an excellent one. We need farmers and settlers and that is the class of people we should endeavor to bring to this country. If the farmers of the east knew of the advantages that this locality offer they would be here instead of in the east. It is up to us to see that they come here.

### Charter Amendments

The City council met last Friday evening with a full attendance.

The main business of the evening was the enactment of an ordinance proposing an amendment to the existing charter of the city and providing for submission of the same to the voters at the coming election on May 12th. The proposed ordinance has relation to streets and sewers, defining the powers of the council and laying out a course of procedure in these matters.

An ordinance was also passed proposing an amendment to the charter and providing a method for the nomination of candidates for city offices.

The proposed amendment provides for the holding of a caucus for this purpose, and also for nomination by any organized body of not less than 25 legal voters of the names of all such nominees being printed on the official ballot.

The next regular meeting will be held next Monday evening.
