### Good Roads Waiting On Meeting December 2

As forecast in the Herald last week, the ship which carries the "Good Roads" banner at her mast head has reached a tortuous place in the channel and without skilful piloting she is liable to pile up, either on the rocks or on the sand. About the best that can be hoped is that it may be a sandy bottom so that she may be launched later uninjured. The bringing up by the North Bend people of a proposal to abandon the Middle fork route for connections with the interior and to build North from the Bay with the expectation of meeting a Douglas county line, at the line, has bailed up the whole proposition to such an extent that a resigniment of the whole plan seems to be necessary.

The meeting at North Bend last Friday was well attended by the North Bend boosters and by those from the north of the Bay and the Tenmile country, as well as a few from this side. President Morrison of the Good Roads association attended from here and tried to get things lined up on a plan which had some chance of being acceptable to all sections of the county, but he does not feel greatly encouraged at the result of the meeting.

The people north of the bay presented their case in such a way as to show that they were entitled to consideration. They were not insistent that the connection with the outside should be made through their territory, but they do insist that a part of the plan shall be the construction of a piece of road that will give them an outlet to the Bay. On the other hand it is very evident that the North Bend people are set on having an outlet to the interior made by way of the Umpqua, bringing the outside travel all into their town. It is also very evident that this will not be satisfactory to those who are interested in the Middle fork route, and the chances of agreement on either plan for the outside connection are exceedingly remote.

The only chance for the Good Roads bonding proposition to get any farther is to drop the whole question of outside connection and devote our attention to the system of interior highway of which the county stands in need. As a matter of fact, there is no certain knowledge of what Douglas county will do. That she is able and willing to build a hard surface road from Roseburg to the mouth of the Umpqua river at this time seems extremely doubtful, and it is foolish to bank on connecting up with her at either point until we know that she will do her part. All this, however need not stop Coos county from building her own system, from which connections can later be made at either point. Not a foot of the road now contemplated for own interior system would
