CIGARETTE MAKING IN CAIRO.

The bales are opened as required, and the various leaves mixed so that four different priced qualities result, the best being that in which there is the least Shnyrus tobacco and the least percentage of large leaves.

English made machines cut the leaves, and on the following day the cigarettes are rolled by Greek, Syrian or Jewish workmen. A clever workman can roll as many as 1,500 a day.

So much for the tobacco; now for the paper. The large Cairo firms employ one kind of paper only, which is made by a half English company at Rome, near Trieste.

The only other ingredient left to consider is the starch for joining the paper. This is used with a thin stick by the men who roll the cigarettes.

My second visit was paid to a well known purveyor who exports 250,000 a week to England alone, and I saw 100 men rolling cigarettes, and bales of finished cigarettes.

My opinion is that no opium or other drug is mixed with the tobacco; and even in hashish dens the devotee buys a bit of the cannabis indica to be rolled with the tobacco.
