RAILROAD ITEMS.

Another Change of Time - 17 Miles of New Road.

Another change of time - 17 miles of new road to be completed by the end of the month.

Chief Engineer Hood and party, who have been surveying in Cow creek canyon for a month or so, have established a new route. It will require 17 miles of new track and one 2 1/2 mile tunnel. About 1,000 men will be put to work on the new road by July 1st. This was made necessary by last winter's slides, and it is said to be a better road than the original.

The Southern Pacific is now asking subsidies all along the line of the narrow gauge in the Willamette valley. They ask for bonds, saying that they are about to commence the work of widening the gauge, building new depots and extending the line on to Springfield and thence to Coos Bay. At Woodburn they ask seven acres for terminal facilities and \$200,000 in cash and at Silverton they asked \$300 and twenty acres.

On July 1st another important change will be made in the schedule of the Oregon express. The time will be shortened three hours. When the change is made the train will leave S. F. at 9 p. m. and arrive in Portland at 10 A. M. The reduction in time will largely be made by putting on a new train between Portland and Roseburg to accommodate the large local traffic and making the Oregon express a through train. By this arrangement twenty-three stops will be avoided. By the new time change the south bound train will be in Ashland about usual, 8:20 a. m., and the north bound about 6:20 p. m.

San Francisco, June 21.—The prospects are favorable for considerable rail road activity in Southern Oregon. Four projects are in contemplation, all having in view Coos bay as their terminal point, so as to take advantage of the steamer service between that place and this city.

The Southern Pacific Company is said to be behind one of the schemes, and so is the Oregon Improvement Company, while the other two projects are being supported by private individuals.

Elijah Smith, president of the Oregon Improvement Company, is reported as now on his way to the coast to order construction of the new line. He is expected to return in a few days with the company's proposed road. It is intended this summer to construct ten miles of road from Empire City, which is on Coos bay, south of the Coquille river, to a distance of ten miles. The final surveys have all been completed and approved by the resident south. The ultimate idea of Smith is said to be an extension east through the valley of the Coquille river to a connection with the Mt. Shasta route at Roseburg.

The project that the Southern Pacific Company had in view is a branch line from Eugene City on the Mt. Shasta route, which will run in a southwesterly direction to Coos bay.

The third scheme is that of some Chicago and San Diego people, who, according to various reports, have organized the Coos Bay, Roseburg and Eastern Railroad and Navigation Company, to build a road seventy-five miles long from Eugene to Coos bay, and to Roseburg, where connection will be made with the Mount Shasta route. The citizens of the two towns mentioned have just ordered a subsidy of \$100,000 for this road.

The fourth scheme is that of some Oregon and Chicago people, who propose building a road from Oregon to the Mount Shasta route, just south of Eugene City, to Coos bay via Elkton. The object of all this proposed activity is to reach the agricultural and timber sections of that part of Oregon.
