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The Fate of the Hood Bills.

The governor's veto of the wagon-road bills came up in the legislature Friday. Miller then introduced an omnibus bill for the wagon roads, all of the vetoed bills being included in this one bill, but the money to come from the 5 per cent fund from public land sales, instead of from the general fund. It passed both houses, but the governor vetoed it for the following reason. As the legislature adjourned before action could be taken on this veto it stands until next session.

I herewith return house bill 296 with my dissent. This bill appropriates "out of the 5 per cent United States land sale fund of Oregon, the sum of \$127,000" to aid the county courts of certain counties in the construction of certain roads, and the construction of a certain road in said county, provided for in said section 2, has been expended and applied as provided by this act, the said secretary of state shall thereupon certify in favor of said county for the sum certified, provided the said amount shall, in no instance, exceed the sum set apart in the act for the construction of the road certified, as provided by section 2 of this act.
