The navy department has decided to begin work at once in transforming the dynamite cruiser Vesuvius into a torpedo boat.

By direction of the president a medal of honor has been presented to Ewell Llewelling G. Estes of the United States volunteers for the most distinguished gallantry in action at Flint River, Ga., Aug. 29, 1864.

A blunder has been discovered in the tariff bill which is almost sure to cause trouble. In the free list of the McKinley act appear these particular items: "Coal, anthracite; 507—Coal, stores of American vessels, but none shall be imported."
