



They were finally com-pelled to abandon the boat 70 miles from Grants Pass, and made the remainder of the trip on foot over the hills. The distance is generally considered 100 miles to the sea by river, but this party thinks it is fully 130 miles. Those Swamp Lands.

Salem, May 4.—The last application for repayment of the 20 per cent alledged to have been advanced on certificates of sale of swamp land by the state is for 83,282 acres, or \$16.656. This claim is presented by C. N. Felton, assignee of H. C. Owens. Since 1890 the state has been asked to take back and refund the payment of 20 per cent on 278,893 acres, amounting to \$55,778. These claims for repayment of money on swamp lands is the result of the actions of the board of land commissioners during Governor Grover's administration. At that time

there was severe criticism of the board for issuing certificates of sale to large areas of vaguely described swamp lands before they were listed as such by the interior department. The Government for defendant. agents were also accused of conniving with land speculators in securing large tracts of the public domain under the tracts of the trac swamp land act. The legislative assembly of 1887 appointed a joint investigating committee to inquire into the management and sale of swamp lands.
