
Some curious experiments have been sewage farms. The result shows an intions as influenced by the herbage manured by the sewage. Where no more sewage goes into the soil than is fully assimilated and transformed by the tissues of the plant cattle and other animals fed on the grass show no deleterious trace in their flesh or milk. If the soil, however, is fully gorged with the sewage, then the herbage crop will be surcharged with the sewage elements and daugerously unfit for cattle to graze. Both meat and milk will be replete with the same constituents, unpleasant to taste and dangerous to the health. The susceptibility of milk to the flavor of the food eaten by cows is well known. But it seems that the effect on the flesh is even more marked and unwholesome.


