

Weighing the Mails.

Mail weighing began all over the United States on Tuesday, to continue

United States on Tuesday, to continue for thirty-five days.

The manner of weighing is not that pursued regularly every four years when weighers are employed on the trains to compute the total bulk. In the present manner of weighing, not pursued for over twenty years, the four classifications of mail are weighed separately.

In accordance with Postmaster Engle's instructions he has to see that the different classifications of mail put upon the trains here are weighed separately during the weighing period. The railway mail clerks are to weigh only the mail, according to classification, that is placed into the drop boxes on the car.

The weighing is a source of considerable trouble to postal and railway mail employees. It is for the purpose of determining the amount of mail carried.
