Fatal Accident to Dr. Robertson. Dr. H. D. Robertson of San Francisco, and formerly of Yreka, who has been out at Bray's place on Antelope in Butte creek yalley, for the past two weeks, met with a very serious accident while on a bear hunt last Monday, by the accidental discharge of his rifle, the bullet passing through the instep of his right foot. He had succeeded in killing three bears on the hunt, and being both delighted and excited, he neglected to adjust the safety of his Savage rifle, in putting it in the case, hence the slide which caused it to shoot, was evidently pushed, so that it discharged the bullet through his heavy hunting boot and right foot. The Savage is a gun that has no lock or trigger, and is discharged by a slide, secured by what is called a safety when adjusted to prevent going off. It also shoots a bullet that expands after discharge from a small bore, making an ugly and danger.
