A CRYSTAL CAVE.

Black Hills Curiosity for the Paris Exposition.

The Mammoth Cave in Elk Creek Canyon to be Reproduced in Miniature for the World's Fair.

The Black Hills will have a curiosity at the Paris exposition in the shape of a miniature of the Mammoth Crystal cave, which is situated in Elk creek canyon, about 20 miles southeast of this city. J. G. Keith, one of the owners of the cave, left Deadwood last night for Paris to sign a contract with the exposition management for space. He has been given a room under the Eiffel tower 50x75 feet, with a high ceiling. He will take over five carloads of material for the construction of the cave, mostly lime water crystals and colored quartz rock, which will line the inside walls of the cavern. The Mammoth Crystal cave made a great hit at the world's fair exposition, later at Atlanta and recently at Antwerp.

The Mammoth Crystal cave was first discovered by the McBride brothers about 12 years ago, while prospecting for a gold mine in Elk Creek canyon, which had been excavated years before by an old prospector named Jacobs. One of the brothers noticed a strong current of air blowing out through a hole in the side of the tunnel, and further investigation opened up a large chamber several feet square. Since the first discovery the owners of the cave have been constantly opening up new chambers and making passages waywardly through them, until it is possible now to walk miles underground and not less than 200 chambers have been opened up.

Fat Man's Misery is the first chamber to be given a name. It is a very low, tortuous passage that leads into a series of rooms beyond. Mold chamber is a weird place, on account of the great quantities of thick, white mold, of delicate texture, very prolific in growth. The next room is called the Menagerie, so called by reason of the different images of animals in stone, the most realistic being the arctic seals. Poverty Flat is a room about 60x250 feet, with a low ceiling. The room derives its name from the fact that the walls are destitute of crystals, being very smooth and water-worn. Notre Dame is the first chamber to show the fine work of the cave. It is a delicate webwork, brownish in color, a little coarser, perhaps, than the honeycomb of the Wind cave. The room is about 60x150, with a ceiling 20 feet high. A distinguished visitor from Chicago had the honor of naming a large chamber after Calkin's Gallery, of Chicago. With a little imagination a person can see in the great many beautiful pictures on the walls and ceiling of the room. Whale room contains some of the menagerie. There is a perfect image of a whale which is 30 feet in length with eyes, mouth, fins and everything in perfect form. Perched above the whale is the American eagle, life size, with wings outstretched.

ABOUT THE CATFISH.

Is Not Yet Made Fully Into a Perfect Fish—Some of Its Quizzes.

The catfish belongs to an ancient type, but fully made into a fish, and hence those whose paired fins are all properly fastened to the head, as his are not, hold him in well-merited scorn. He has no scales and no bright colors. His fins are small, and his head and mouth are enormous. Around his mouth are eight long "smellers," fleshy feelers, that he pushes out as he crawls along the bottom in search of anything that he may eat. In each of the fins which represent his arms is a long, sharp bone, with a slimy surface and a serrated edge. These are fastened by a ball and socket joint, and whenever the fish is alarmed the bone is whirled over and set in place, then it sticks out stiffly on each side. There is another bone, the backbone, which is long and when all of these are set there is no fish that can swallow him, says the Popular Science Monthly.

TICKED FIVE CENTURIES.
The Famous Old Town Clock in Rouen Has Kept Time for 510 Years.

Rouen, one of the principal cities of France, and the greatest seat of its cotton manufacture, possesses the oldest clock in the world. The great Rouen clock has held its place in that city for 510 years and is the pride of its citizens. Placed in 1389, it has been running without interruption from that day to this, requiring nothing except cleaning and a few trifling repairs of its accessory parts. The great clock had so accustomed the citizens to look upon its exactitude as a matter of course that when, in 1572, the breaking of a wire prevented its sounding five minutes, the people of the city were in a state of consternation.

The magistrates summoned the custodian—Guillaume Petit—and remonstrated gravely with him. Until 1712 the great clock had no pendulum. For 323 years it had been run by a "foliot," an apparatus unknown to the majority of modern clockmakers. The pendulum in clockwork was introduced in 1659, but so well satisfied were the people of Rouen with the time-keeping qualities of their famous old clock that 53 years were allowed to pass before a pendulum was substituted for the "foliot." Equipped with this new apparatus it has continued to this day to strike the hours and chime the quarters.
