I answer that no conven.ence, no expediency, no obligation, ever justified a breach of the national good faith, "Let me add, too, that this Puerto Rican legislation is testing us before the eyes of the Filipinos, who keep well informed on all our doings. They will

judge by this legislation the value of American promises. When the ablest and most statesmanlike of Aguinaldo's emissaries to the Philippine commission once expressed the tear that the American government might not keep the promises it was making, for Spain, said he, mode promises and broke them, I silenced him with the reply, 'Senor, the United States is not Spain.' Is he now. to learn, are all the Filipinos now to learn, that in the first legislation for our dependencies we prove faithless to our pledge and recreant to our obligations? Such an exhibition of ourselves will strengthen the hands of Aguinaldo and the insurgents, because, unhappily, it can be used to support their persistent satement that the Americans are no more trustworthy than the Spaniards.
