The Chinese Situation

London, June 17.—Dispatches from Tien-Tsin received in Berlin say that the Boxers entered Peking on the evening of June 18, destroyed several missions and attacked the legations, but were repulsed with the aid of Maximis. No Europeans were reported killed. The attitude of the Chinese troops toward the Boxers was unceremonious...

A cable from London, June 18 says: A dispatch from Peking dated June 18, says the Chinese government is bewildered and cannot decide whether to rigidly suppress the Boxers or defy the world. The decision rests with the emperor. Their repugnance in regard to the foreigner's guns is pitiable. They hold the officials of Tung-Chan for redemption. Anarchy reigns in Tung-Chan.

The German minister has been captured. A crowd of Boxers occupy Legation street, cutting off communication between the buildings, which are occupied by foreign representatives.

American in the interior of two neighboring provinces have been advised to leave. Several of them have means of doing so unless a relief force is sent. There is danger of massacre of native Christians. Three trains conveying a relief force are on the way to Peking. A large Chinese army is ready to oppose them.

The German minister has been captured. A crowd of Boxers occupy Legation street, cutting off communication between the buildings, which are occupied by foreign representatives.

A serious anti-foreign outbreak took place last night, when the finest buildings in the eastern part of the city were burned and hundreds of native Christians and servants employed by foreigners were massacred within two miles of the imperial palace.

The Boxers burned the Roman Catholic East Cathedral, the large hall of the Legation of Mission in American Board of Missions, and also the buildings in the eastern part of the city occupied by the foreign employes of the maritime consulates.

Telegraphic communications with the north, says the Shanghai correspondent of the Times, under Sunday's date "ceased early this morning. The last message from Tien-tsin reported that fighting had begun, but gave no details. Messages from the north are now forwarded by steamer from Shaofo.

The Boxer movement is gaining strength after the immunity with which the recent outrages have been committed, and it is likely to spread rapidly. Telegrams received here yesterday by the consuls from the fleet at Tientsin describe the position of the forces under Admiral Seymour, close to Peking, as serious, since it is confronted by General Tung Fuh Siang's troops, with their hand on the Tientsin railway.

The secretary of war has decided to send all troops necessary to protect American interests in China. The Ninth infantry is reported to be at Manila ready to proceed to the seat of trouble on a moment's notice.
