DAIRYING ABOUT ASHLAND.

The Organization of a Co-Operative Creamery Proved a Profitable Enterprise. That full advantage is not taken of the possibilities of dairying in Oregon is strongly demonstrated in this section of the state. After leaving the southernmost creamery in the Willamette valley, a wide expanse of country must be traversed before another is reached and then it is found at Ashland. The Ashland creamery plant was established in 1898. Two years were required for it to gain a footing and earn profit for the owners. It is now long past the stage of experimental enterprise, but its growth is slow because of the dearth of milk cows. The plant does not obtain an amount of milk at any time sufficient to enable it to operate at more than half its capacity, and because of the limited milk supply it does not attempt to manufacture cheese. But in face of the proven value of the creamery and the profits in milk cows which it makes available to the farmers, the district originally conceived of the enterprise is being rapidly broken down and there is promise of very great increase in the milk supply of this section.

An examination of some of the details of this business confirms what is generally proven to be elsewhere, a safe and profitable industry. The butter-maker, and that good milk cows convenient to a creamery are a very desirable kind of property. The dairy supply of Oregon brought to this creamery averages 5000 pounds, it is never in excess of 5000 pounds. The amount of butter turned out runs from 120 to 200 pounds a day. The percentage of butter fat in the milk averages 4.8. Twenty-one cents a pound is paid for butter fat, and that an exceptionally fine milk cow will earn \$25 a year. Then there is the calf, which alone makes a profit for the farmer. The butter is shipped as far south as Redding and north to Roseburg, but most of the output is consumed locally. The total output is equal to only a fraction of the butter-making capacity. A high price is obtained for the butter product, the average being 22 1/2 cents a pound.
