BLUE LEDGE NEWS.

Progress of Work Being Done in the Copper District.

A number of mining men from the Blue Ledge district were at Yreka recently on business and the News says of their visit: A. T. Lundgren, one of the visiting party, who is extensively interested in mining property in the Blue Ledge district, gave us some valuable information. Mr. Lundgren says there are 20 feet of good, solid sulphide ore on the Blue Ledge, and the last three feet encountered is solid borate, sometimes called purple copper ore. It is an actual fact that this last three foot streak runs 30 to 80 per cent copper and from 30 to 250 gold per ton, including 18 ounces silver to the ton.

Scattered Witnesses in Jennings Murder Trial.

Grants Pass, April 19.—The case of the State of Oregon vs. Jasper Jennings, convicted of the murder of his father at the Granite Hill mine near this city, which decision was reversed by the Supreme Court and a new trial ordered should come up for trial at the term of court now in session, and it is understood that District Attorney Reames has issued several subpoenas in an effort to get the state's witnesses together. OUR LOCAL INDIANS.

Remnant of Those Who Inhabited This Valley For Over 1000 Years.

Remnants of 12 tribes of the Indians that possessed the wilds of Southern Oregon and Northern California before the coming of the white man, and for some struggling and perilous years thereafter, are still found in the Grand Ronde Reservation in Yamhill County. When this agency was established in 1854 the Indians who were restricted to these lands numbered 500 and then as now represented 12 tribes now numbered 362, all told. The warrior of these tribes, the most warlike of which were the Umpqua and Calapoos, had made the Government much trouble and were a terror to the settlers of the Umpqua and Rogue River valleys for many anxious years.

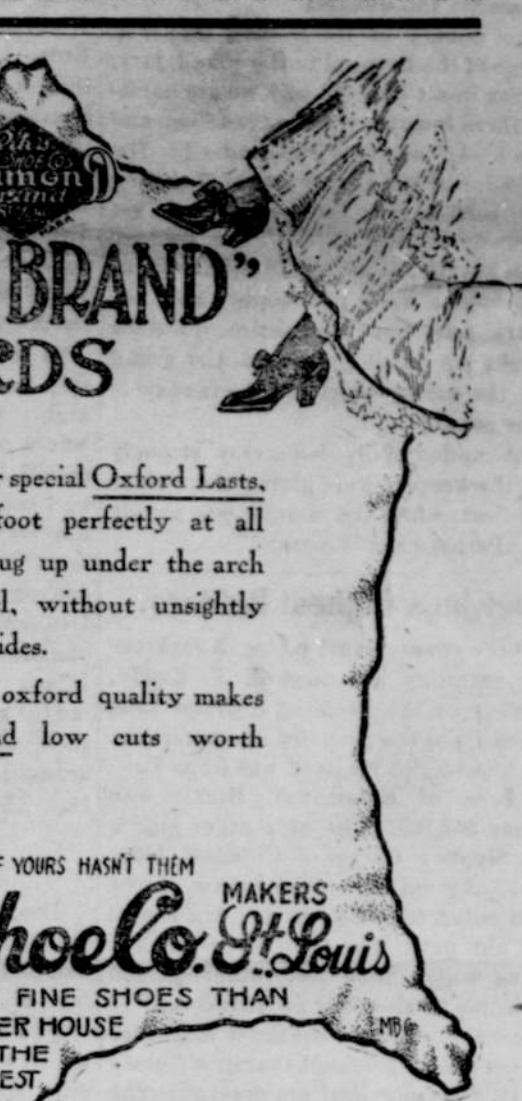
