

# Abbot Cagers Barely Defeat College Squad

The Camp Abbot basketball team, victor by a wide margin in five contests this season, almost met its first reverses when it took on a team representing the Department of Military Science and Tactics of the University of Oregon at the Post Recreation Hall in two contests Saturday and Sunday. Score for the first game, played before the largest crowd ever to witness a cage contest on the Post, was 41 to 35 and for the Sunday tiff, 39 to 37.

Camp Abbot forged into the lead early in the first contest and at half time led the university squad 14 to 6. In the third quarter however, the collegiate quintet staged a comeback to gain a one point lead and keep the contest on a tit-for-tat basis until the last five minutes of play when Camp Abbot staged a rally which carried it over the top.

High scorer for Camp Abbot was Tucker with a total of 18 points. Sullivan led for the college squad with 13.

Sunday afternoon's contest was a nip-and-tuck affair with the two teams swapping the lead throughout. Moylan of the visiting squad took high point honors with 22 tallies, against 12 for Higginbotham, high point man for Camp Abbot. Lt. Demgen paced the post squad in floor operations. Referees were Lt. Kubes and Pvt. Bush.

In a preliminary contest Saturday night, members of a Wac administrative sextette defeated a Wac Medical unit squad 18 to 10. Vanderiff scored eight points for the administrative team to take top honors, and Mayer and Heble led for the Medics with four each.

# Trout Season to Open April 15

Camp Abbot anglers can begin trying their luck again in the Deschutes River in mid-April, according to the state game commission which this week set April 15 for the opening of the 1944 trout fishing season and Oct. 31 for the close. Dates are the same for all counties in the state.

Other than a slight change which forbids fishing below 400 yards north of boathouses at the Paulina Lake resort, no changes were announced for Deschutes county. The limit remains the same, 15 fish or 15 pounds and one fish in any one day, but not to exceed 30 fish or 30 pounds and two fish in any seven consecutive days or in possession at any one time.
