Signs Of The Times

Japan is mobilizing into her navy all merchant seamen up to the age of sixty, according to a Tass dispatch from Moscow. Young students are also being recruited.

Seat of the German government has been moved from bomb-blasted Berlin to Breslau, a large city about 175 miles to the southeast. The new capital is situated some 680 miles from the English coast and 670 miles from the allied air base at Foggia, Italy. These figures reveal that the Nazi government machinery is still within announced bombing range. The announcement from Naples sources also stated that the transfer began several weeks ago.

A recent tabulation from official allied announcements shows the score in the gigantic air war now raging over Germany is better than two-to-one. During a period of six days 440 German planes were destroyed in the air and on the ground while 195 Allied aircraft were lost.

An all-woman troop train crawled across the nation recently, to inaugurate a new navy

idea which was designed, according to Ensign Harriet Hennessy, "to let the East get an idea of how the women of the West are answering the call to relieve men for combat duty."

Soldier's Death Is Object Lesson for Those on Pass

A sad story with a clear warning—is this tale of a soldier who was granted a pass authorizing him to be absent from his organization from 5 p. m. of one evening to 6 a. m. of the next morning to visit a nearby town. Instead, he went to another town.

On his way back, just a short way from camp, he was killed in an automobile accident. The Judge Advocate General has ruled that his death was not in line of duty because he traveled beyond the limits of his pass.

hauled and an indoor stairway between the upper and lower portions installed.
