Following several days of debate, the house passed the "GI bill of rights" by a roll-call vote of 367 to 0 last Thursday after striking out an amendment that would have prohibited unions from requiring veterans to hold union card to work in a

The maximum government guaranteed loan to veterans was raised by the house from \$1500 to \$2500, but the period of unemployment compensation coverage was not increased from 26 to 52 weeks, as was generally amendments to reduce loan intest rates from 6 to 4 per cent. Rejected also was the amendment to ban payment of unemployment benefits to veterans who engage in strikes.
