A MOVE FOR BETTER BEEF.

Portland is stirred up over recent facts brought to light concerning the supply of beef which is being consumed in that city. Some of it is diseased and unfit for either man or beast to eat, and, as a result, the consensus of opinion leans toward the creation of a state Board of Health which will do away to a great extent with the poisonous food which is being forced upon the public.

The move is a good one. Oregon is one out of the three states in the union which is without an organization of this kind, and yet the percentage of cattle which is raised within its borders is four times larger than in some of the states in which the regulations of the state health boards are rigorously enforced.

Oregon has long needed a state institution which would place restrictions upon the promiscuous killing of tainted beef. Eastern Oregon is in need of it, so is the western portion of the state. A state board of health with a well regulated system of inspection would add materially to the character of the beef which is eaten by the public. The ban would be placed upon cattle affected with tuberculosis and infectious diseases, and cattle weakened from sickness or other causes would not find a place in the markets quite as readily and freely as they do at present.

The demand for a board of health and a system of inspection is needed just as badly in the sparsely settled districts as in Portland or any other city in the state, for it is from these distant sections that the cities draw their beef supply. The latter is not always as near to the standard as it might be. In fact the community around Bend can testify to the reverse. It had a sample of beef killing last year which fortunately was headed off before any disastrous results occurred. That beef was ROTTEN. It was unfit to feed even to a dog and yet it would have been shoveled upon the residents of Bend as gracefully as a Christmas dinner of turkey if the facts had not become known. A state board of health with the attending investigation of cattle districts would do away with such an open and knowing jeopardization of human lives. It is not the fault of the man who kills such beef that fatalities are averted, and the quicker he is brought under the strong arm of the law the better it will be for the safety and welfare of the residents of the community in which he carries on his trade.
