A report from Shaniko, states that there is a case of Smallpox in that city and that one of the hotels is under quarantine.
The roads in the timber belt of this section are becoming almost impassable, caused by the melting of the snow and thawing of the frozen ground.

A party of five people from Portland, Oregon, who filed on Homesteads in this section some time ago are here trying to build houses on them, but could not get lumber at any price, they are now building log cabins.

C. B. Don, of Antelope passed through on Tuesday's stage on his way home from a trip to the Silver Lake, and Paisley country.

Mr. Don has been investigating the stock-raising and agricultural possibilities of that section, and seems well pleased with the outlook.

A petition, for the establishment of a tri-weekly mail route from the Warm Spring Agency, via Sisters, to the Deschutes, is being circulated at Sisters, this it a good move and the residents of this section will be given a chance to help the matter along.
