Commissioner Lawrence has purchased a half interest in the Bend Bulletin. C. G. Richardson of Lava, was transacting business in town the first of the week. Messrs. F. Downing, R. G. Smith and Mr. Conkling were Prineville visitors last Tuesday. Messrs. Ora Poindexter and W. H. Sportsman were visitors in our town several days this week. The County Court will be petitioned to grant another saloon license in the Bend precinct. John Bloss returned, on Saturday, from a brief sojourn in Wasco county and is now registered at the Staats Hotel. The residence of Richard King is rapidly nearing completion and will make a very comfortable home when finished. John Chambers, Joe Elliott and W. T. Casey arrived on Thursday, each with a load of grain for the local merchants. The C. I. Winnek Drug Co. of Prineville, expect to erect a good substantial building in this city in the near future. S. I. Co's. camp, on Wednesday and left for Bear Creek, where he goes to buy hay. He says that 20 or 25 Grass Valley teams will arrive here the first of next week.
