General News.

The Prineville smallpox epidemic has entirely disappeared. More frauds are being unearthed in the Postoffice Department, and several men of high standing in that department now find themselves facing serious charges. Japan has an avenue of trees fifty miles in length. The trees are cryptomers, and every one is a perfect specimen, quite straight, from 130 to 150 feet in height, and twelve to fifteen feet in circumference. The avenue extends from the town of Namanda to Nikko.

A new organization back east is a little the crankiest of them all. It is composed of women who will promote celibacy, preventing marriage where possible. The records on divorcees, wife beating etc. will be searched and promulgated among the young women of the country.

The April immigrant arrivals at all ports of the United States numbered 128,286' the largest number ever recorded of a single month. For the ten months of the fiscal year arrivals number 620,711' and the May and June inport promises to carry the figure above that of 788,992, which was reached in the fiscal year 1882, and for 20 years had stood as the high record of immigration.
