Several members of the Baseball Association have been improving the grounds, this week, on which they expect to play on July 4th.

The Deschutes, Bend, and Lytle aggregation will celebrate in style befitting a city of greater proportions, some of the attractions will consist of a ball game, Prineville vs Deschutes, and a Grand Ball in the evening, other sports will be arranged for later, everybody is cordially invited to come, July 4th and 5th.

Mr. and Mrs. Chas. F. Schmerker, of Pennsylvania were business visitors in our city, on Tuesday. Mr. Schmerker is representing the Chattanooga, Medicine Co. and is making a personal inspection of the interior of Oregon, having driven through from Southern Oregon via Lakeview and Silver Lake.

On Monday last a heavy rain and hail storm passed over Lower Crooked River, and a part of the Haystack and Willow Creek section, at some places hail stones as large as hen eggs fell, which done considerable damage to growing crops, broke window lights, split the shingles on the roofs, and killed poultry and small animals. The heaviest part of the storm just missed Prineville or the loss might have been much greater.

The school-meeting held in this district last Monday, proved to be one of the most exciting events of the season. The meeting was called to order by Mr. Awbrey, who requested L. D. Weist to act as chairman, the minutes of last meeting and the clerk's financial report were read and adopted. After a protracted wrangle between the opposing factions and much discussion as to the interpretation of the school-law relating to qualified voters, a number of voters were challenged and compelled to state, under oath, the grounds on which they claimed the right to vote, the meeting then proceeded with the election of officers, John Steidl was elected director for a term of three years by a majority of three votes and D. F. Steffa clerk, for one year, by a majority of two. Owing to objections made by A. M. Drake as to the validity of several votes the chairman refused to declare the officers elect, duly elected and the matter now stands open until decided by a higher authority.

CLOUD-BURST AND FLOOD.

At Heppner, Oregon, on Sunday last one of the most destructive Cloud-bursts that has ever happened in this state, fell on that city without a moments warning or any chance of escape, nearly five hundred people were hurled into eternity, and thousands of dollars worth of property washed away or destroyed. At last report, which came by telephone about 265 bodies had been recovered, and the work of rescue was still going on. Many who were not killed were injured and hundreds are left homeless and destitute. A relief train with supplies and assistants were sent from The Dalles, on Monday and another from Portland on Tuesday containing 100 cots, bedding, supplies and medicines.

DIED.

At Rosland, Oregon, on Tuesday, June 16, 1903, Mrs. Bradshaw, wife of Amos Bradshaw, passed away after loving hands had done all within their power to save her. Mrs. Bradshaw was brought here from the East about a month ago with the hope that the change would benefit her health, but to no avail. Mr. Bradshaw and their two daughters Mand and Jessie, were with her during the last hours and accompanied the remains to Prineville, where they will be interred temporarily.

At her home in this city, at 2.20 A. M. Tuesday, June 19, 1903, Mrs. Ida M. Donkel, wife of S. P. Donkel, was suddenly called to her home beyond the grave. Her death was due to heart failure and came without a moments warning, as she did not awaken from her sleep, a physician was summoned but life was extinct when he arrived.

The funeral services were held in the school-house at 3 P. M. Wednesday, and were conducted by Rev. O. W. Triplett of Prineville. Ida M. Kingsbury was born in Cleveland, Ohio, Oct. 20, 1849; was married to S. P. Donkel, in 1872; They moved from Ohio to Michigan thence to Iowa and came to Oregon in 1886, settling in Columbia Co. They came to Crook county in 1899, and have made their home here since that time. Mrs. Donkel was a kind and loving mother and a friend to both old

and young. She leaves a husband, three sons, H. W. C. M. and I. M. Donkel, two daughters Iva B. and Bessie R. Donkel, and a host of friends to mourn her loss.
