The horseshoe for this section closed the first of the week and the headquarters moved to Bear Creek Buttes. Horsemen have met with poor success in gathering their stock this spring.

Deputy sheriff Claypool was over from Prineville the first of the week armed with a replevin and a fishing rod. He caught a fine string with one of the instruments but failed with the other on account of poor bait.

Mr. J. W. Moprow is having the Lytle townsite resurveyed with Frank Hodson in charge of the work. It is expected that lots will be on sale at an early date the property now being owned by the Columbia Southern Townsite Company.

The Columbia Southern Irrigation Company has raised the wages of its men from \$2.00 to \$2.25 per day and the price of board, \$4.50 per week, will not be changed. This will mean an increase of about 15 per cent to the men.

The hearing of the petition for and the remonstrance against the changing of the county road before the County Court at Prineville last Wednesday resulted in favorable action being taken by the court after the remonstrance had been withdrawn.

D. F. Steffa has brought a replevin suit against J. M. Lawrence for possession of the school records of this district. It seems that the copy served by the deputy sheriff was defective and he returned to Prineville without the books. Later Mr. Lawrence delivered the books to the sheriff and secured them again by filing a re-delivery bond and now has them. Mr. Steffa also asks damages from Mr. Lawrence in the amount of \$25.00. Attorney Barnes appeared for the plaintiff and Attorney Brink for the defendant.

G. M. Cornett, has established a daily passenger and freight line between, Deschutes and Prineville, which will make connection with the Prineville Shaniko Stage line, enabling passengers to reach Shaniko from here, or vice versa, in 24 hours. Such a line has been needed for the past year, the Vandeventer line being wholly inadequate to accommodate the traffic, making only three trips a week and not connecting with Prineville stages. All that is now lacking is a daily mail which is fully warranted by the increasing population and amount of mail, it not being uncommon to have four or five sacks of mail at one time. By a proper showing a daily mail service would be granted and this should be attended to by our citizens without waiting for the mail contractors, to take the initiative.
