The railroad accident on the Southern Pacific five miles north of Salem which occurred one evening last week was the worst that has ever occurred in the northwest. The southbound overland train crashed through the trestle which crosses Lake Latish and fell a distance of about sixteen feet completely wrecking the train. The engineer, fireman and an unknown man supposed to be a tramp were instantly killed and nearly all the passengers were more or less injured and many of them very seriously, some of them having died since. We will not go into the details of a description as nearly every one has no doubt read a full account of the accident before this. It is unusual for so many to be seriously injured in an accident and no more killed.

The hotel formerly known as the Cook has changed hands again. It is now in possession of J. W. Bowers, lately from Nebraska. Following the example of his predecessor, Mr. Bowers has changed the name of the house to the West Side, which is a good one, and we trust he will succeed in making the name popular. He will make an earnest endeavor in that line, and the effort will be backed up by the assistance of his lady, who has had fifteen years experience in the business. —Reporter.

One thing is quite certain. It will be a blessing to McMinnville if Mr. Bowers succeeds in his undertaking for if there is one thing that the county seat needs more than another it is a well kept hotel.

He Was Surprised.
Rev. E. W. Clarke, the traveling correspondent for Frank Leslie's Illustrated Weekly, who has been traveling in the Northwest says: "This whole Northwest is a wonder to me. I can hardly believe my senses. I, in common with the people of the east, have labored under the impression that here were the wilds of America. Here in Oregon I expected to find frontier settlements of logs and adobe with little patches of vegetables, wheat and Indian corn, growing among the stumps of recently fallen forests. Instead I find thriving cities, which for push and enterprise are far ahead of towns in the east. And here, too, it is to be found one of the greatest wheat centers in the country. The people of the east will not conceive it until they come and see for themselves."
The above is a very fair sample of the view a great many eastern people have of the development of the west and it is refreshing to hear one of those dapper young fellows admit that he has had his blind eyes opened. Several years ago while in Washington City, a young fellow who was running an elevator in the Arlington hotel, asked the size of the city of Indianapolis. We replied that about 135,000 inhabitants were claimed for the city. "Well! well!" said he, with staring eyes, "I can't conceive how a city of that size can have grown up away out on the frontier of the wild west. This remark was about on an equality with the one in an era of a couple of young ladies who were on their way from Indiana to Oregon a few years ago. The subject of mission work was up when one of them remarked that they intended to organize a Sunday school at Newberg when they arrived there.

On the River.
There is considerable interest manifested as to how many boats will be operated on the Willamette river the coming season. The Oregon Pacific have had their three boats thoroughly repaired during the summer, and now they are only awaiting the rise of the river when they will start up in full force. The Union Pacific will probably run three boats. Two of their boats are old and in poor condition to carry on the traffic of the river. The Madras is the only one of their upper Willamette river boats that is really fit for the service without a thorough repairing. There is strong talk of the Union Pacific buying the O. P. boats, or putting some new boats on the line. The latter would doubtless be the better plan. In addition to these there will be two independent boats plying on the river during the winter. The steamer Salem is ready to run on this route as soon as there is sufficient water. There seems to be some truth in the statement that Capt. Scott will have an independent boat on the river in a short time. A few days of rain would give a boating stage to the river. The people are anxiously waiting to hear the familiar blast of whistles of the river craft.—Cap. Journal.

One of the boats mentioned above as belonging to the Union Pacific is the old Orient which has passed back and forth up and down the river week in and week out for these many years. The old familiar whistle has long greeted the ears of those living within reach of the river. Our first trip on the beautiful Willamette was made on the Orient with Capt. Jensen at the wheel ten years ago, and the boat was not new by any means then. The old craft has seen enough service to entitle her to a pass to the bone yard and the Union Pacific ought to give the public better service with a new boat.

FROM SALEM.
Transportation for Fruit and Dairy Products—Capital Flour Mills—Etc.
SALEM, Nov. 12.—Negotiations are pending which promise to result in the early consummation of a scheme for building and operating a light draft boat, to run on the river, thirty or forty miles up and down in the vicinity of Salem. It will be built jointly by the Salem Canning Company and George S. Swart, lately from Kansas, who is here arranging for the establishment of a cannery. The boat will be used in gathering up fruit and milk for delivery at Salem.
It is rumored this evening that the sale of the big Capital mills is about consummated, and that the result of the sale will be the early starting of the wheel which has been idle so long. The mill property is worth over \$200,000.—Oregonian.
