NEWBERG WINS PENNANT.

Pacific College Scores the Victory in the State College Athletic Meet at McMinnville.

The Newberg contingent which journeyed to McMinnville last Friday to see Pacific College and Heater set off the fire works in the second annual field meet of the Oregon College Athletic League...

The first one was in the start of the 50 yard dash. Every man on the scratch but Heater started before the crack of the pistol...

The second accident (?) was in the last quarter of the mile relay when Wire of Albany threw himself against Heater, knocking him down, and causing him to lose 40 yards and the race.

The spirit of friendship and co-operation manifested for Newberg was due largely to the unorthodox conduct of the Albany aggregation, at several times during the meet.

Newberg owes its victory largely to its phenomenal athlete Roy Heater. Rumors had been floating about that Heater was going to be shown a few things this year, but the events proved throughout that it was the other fellows who were from Missouri.

The passage of the River and Harbor bill is a great success for Oregon. The total of appropriations amount to nearly \$5,500,000, chief of which are \$1,500,000 for the entrance of the Columbia; \$225,000 for the river to Portland; \$314,000 to commence work on the ship canal around the dallas to Celilo; \$28,000 to complete work from Riparia to Lewiston; \$25,000 to be expended above Lewiston; \$20,000 to complete work at Cascades; \$50,000 for Coos Bay; \$30,000 for Coquille; \$35,000 for the Siuslaw; \$27,000 to finish work at Tillamook.

50 yard dash—Heater, P C 1st; Torbet, Albany, 2nd; Pelling, Dallas, 3rd; time, 0:5 3/5.

Heater, P C 2nd; Kramien, P C 3rd; distance 21 feet. 440 yard run—Heater, P C 1st; Adams, McM 2nd; Coates, Albany, 3rd; time 0:52.

Discus throw—Morrison, Albany, 1st; Evenden, O S N 2nd; Ellis, Dallas, 3rd; distance 91 feet 8 in.

High jump—The between Heater, of Pacific, and Wire and Morrison, of Albany, at 5 feet 3 in; points were divided.

Mile relay—Albany, first, Pacific second, Monmouth, third.

At the business meeting of the league officers were elected for the ensuing year as follows: President, W. L. Marks, Albany; vice president, Calvin Blair, Newberg; secretary, Daniel Poling, Dallas; treasurer, E. A. Smith, McMinnville; second vice president, W. A. Tupper, Monmouth.
