TELEPHONES.

Relating How a Country Town Choked off the Coast Telephone Monopoly, Put in and Maintained Its Own System.

By Edgar L. Hampton, in the Seattle Mail and Herald. If our degree of savagery as a people is to be measured by the number of our physical commodities, then we are far less savage than we were five years ago.

The idea of a country system of phones originated in the Sew West, first among the thriving business men of Newberg, Oregon, a town of fifteen hundred inhabitants or thereabouts, situated on the west bank of the Willamette river.

It was the outgrowth of a bluff on the part of that well-known, soulless corporation, the Pacific States Telephone & Telegraph Co., known in Seattle as the Sunset Telephone Co.

To begin with there was the Willamette Telephone Company, a small long-distance concern connecting the county seat of Yamhill county with Portland.

money for a telephone system of their own, both country and city, similar to one known to be in successful operation in some eastern states.

Its history from its inception, twelve months ago, is most interesting. I regret that space prevents my telling it here at a greater length.

Of course the Bell company put in a competitive line in the country forthwith and with great bluster put men forth into the country districts to install telephones, using the argument that all the merchants in Newberg had the Bell phone, and only a few had the "home" phone—a statement that could not be denied.

The one card held by the Bell company was the fact that the Bell phone people had persuaded the railroad to refuse to put the "Home" phone in the local railway station.

As for the Newberg Telephone Company, if the best reports may be credited, it is as well established and firmly fixed as Gibraltar.

Letter from Aaron Bray.

The Graphic is in receipt of an interesting letter from Rev. Aaron M. Bray, extra of which follow: "After the close of the Five Year's Meeting at Indianapolis, we came to Hamilton county and have been engaged in visiting our relatives and friends of former years.

"The forests that once covered this county have very largely disappeared, many of the farmers now using coal for fuel. The Buttonwood ponds have nearly all been drained and are now the fruitful fields.

"The more important towns of the county have made large growth, and most substantial improvements. The leading roads of the county are graveled and are kept in repair by taxation.

"There are three Quarterly Meetings of Friends in this county, sixteen churches, and three others near the line in other counties belonging to these quarters.

"We find that Washington shingle mills now furnish the roofs for Indiana homes. I have seen but few prunes, although I have not made a special investigation.
