The executive committee of the Yamhill County Pioneer Association has decided to hold the next pioneer meeting at McMinnville on the first Wednesday in June.

At the republican county convention held Saturday, J. C. Hodson and L. M. Parker were elected as delegates from Newberg to the Eugene convention, and are attending the same accompanied by their wives.

The band boys are preparing for a series of four concerts to be given at intervals of two or three weeks, the first to come off near May 1. Season reserved seat tickets will be sold for a dollar and general admission for seventy-five cents. The boys should be liberally patronized by Newberg people.

The Friends Sunday School will commemorate Easter Sunday morning by appropriate exercises by the intermediate and primary grades. On Saturday Clarence Butt appeared before the county court in support of the free ferry proposition, which has been up for discussion for some time. The court

deferred definite action, and on Wednesday killed the project, much to the disappointment of citizens of this end of the county. However, due credit should be given Commissioner McCrea, who loyally supported the ferry, his action being fully justified by the large petition of taxpayers in this section of Yamhill county, and by section 4965 Bellingham and Cotton annotated Laws of Oregon, and by the written opinion of Attorney John Gearin of Portland, one of the ablest lawyers in the state.

Hon. Aaron Jones, of South Bend, Indiana, Master of the National Grange, Mr. B. G. Leedy, Master of the State Grange, and State Deputy Cyrus H. Walker, of Albany, Oregon, are now in Yamhill county in the work of organizing granges. The National Master can spend only this week in this county, as he is soon to visit California. He spoke at Dayton last Wednesday afternoon and organized Dayton grange with about 40 charter members, Deputy Walker assisting. Mr. Walker is now in Newberg to arrange for a public meeting here this (Friday) evening, to be held in Crater's hall. Mr. Jones is an eloquent speaker and has a national reputation. All are invited. He wishes that not only the farmers but the business men should be present to hear his address.
