Mr. Parrott of Dundee, attended all the sessions of the convention, leading the singing and speaking words of encouragement.

The Dundee ladies entertained royally, serving bountiful lunches in the church at the noon hour. Since much of the success of the convention depends upon the local union where the convention is held, we must attribute to our hostess a good share of the success of this assembly.

The convention adjourned to meet in Newberg in October.
