Along at this time of the year the question of adequate water supply confronts the city. The reservoir barely met the needs of Newberg when put in, and with the steady growth of the town the need of a much larger reservoir becomes more and more apparent. As it is the council finds it necessary to economize with the water and at an adjourned meeting Tuesday evening, the rules for lawn sprinkling were changed accordingly. Hereafter lawns may be sprinkled from 6 to 6:30 a. m. and from 7 to 7:30 p. m. All sprinkling shall be done by a spray or sprinkler attached to the hose or by holding the hose. In no case shall it be permissible to run water through the hose while the latter is lying upon the ground or stationary.
