Heacock & Heacock, the jewelers, have placed a regulator in the postoffice which is at once a great convenience for the public and a good advertisement of their business.

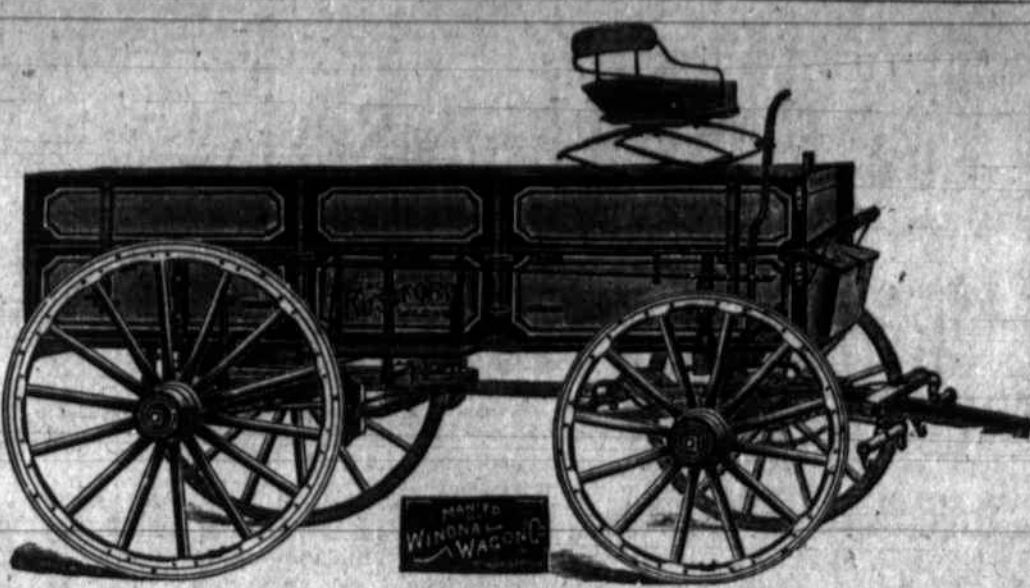
