A Pioneer Dies.

Yamhill county lost another prominent pioneer Saturday in the death, from rheumatism of the heart, of Hon. C. H. Burch at his home two miles east of Amity. Born in Missouri, 1828, his parents died while he was young, and he came across the plains in 1844 in Colonel Ford's company. He was a veteran of the Mexican war and was in the first rush to the California gold fields in 1849. He was a member of the Oregon legislature in 1878 and in 1884 was elected state senator.

Of the number that crossed the plains with Mr. Burch in 1844, very few are now living. Among the number are William McChrisman of McMinnville, C. McChrisman, The Dalles, Mrs. Darr, Dayton, Mr. Perkins, Lafayette, and O. Neil of McMinnville.

Mr. Burch's wife and nine children, one of which is Mrs. L. M. Grames of this place, survive him.
