## Public Record of Hon. B. L. Eddy, Republican Candidate for Circuit Judge.

B. L. Eddy, one of the republican candidates for circuit judge in the third judicial district, has been practicing law in Tillamook county for the past eight years, where he has for some time enjoyed the leading law practice. Before locating at Tillamook he had resided for some years at Portland where he began the practice of law. He is a native of Washington county, Oregon, and has spent his life on the Pacific Coast. He is now in his thirty-ninth year, and a hard worker at everything he undertakes. He has always been an enthusiastic republican and during each campaign for several years he has taken the stump for the ticket. He has been twice elected to the Oregon House of Representatives, and in that body he made a record for hard work and careful attention to important measures affecting the general welfare. He served first in the session of 1901, and took an active part in all important work of the session, being generally recognized as a leader in the House. He was, during that session, chairman of the committee on food and dairy products and zealously assisted in the preparation and passage of the present food and dairy law, which has proven of great benefit to the dairymen of the state, and has been of special benefit in Tillamook, the banner dairy county. In addition to this work, Mr. Eddy was member of the committee on judiciary, where he found ample opportunity to make use of his legal training, and he was at once recognized as one of the members of the committee who "did things." Being re-elected to the House in 1902, Mr. Eddy became at the session of 1903, chairman of the committee on judiciary, and again made a record for hard work and careful attention to the business of the committee. His conservatism and energy in this work elicited flattering notices from the press of the state while the legislature was in session. But Mr. Eddy's principal work at the session of 1903, was in the original framing and introduction a passage of what is now known as the "Eddy Corporation Tax Law." In accordance with his usual conservative methods, Mr. Eddy submitted the first draft of this bill to the Hon. F. I. Dunbar, secretary of state, and Hon. J. N. Teal, president of the Taxpayer's League of Portland, and with their advice and assistance, together with that of Hon. T. G. Green, attorney for the Taxpayer's League, the bill was finally reduced to the form in which Mr. Eddy introduced it into the legislature. It has been pronounced the most popular and successful piece of legislation that Oregon has enacted in many years. Under its operation the corporations of the state are paying into the state treasury over one hundred thousand dollars a year to the relief of the farmers and other owners of tangible property. When it is considered that this law saves to every person who pays taxes on real property about one-half of a mill each year on his state tax, its popularity is easily understood.

## Yamhill County Tickets.

For the first time in the memory of the younger generation at least, the republican and democratic county nominating conventions were held on the same day. It is the rule for the republicans to lead off, allowing the democrats to follow and profit by any mistakes their opponents may have made. This year, however, the date of the republican convention, Friday May 6th, was the last day on which a nominating convention could be held, the result being that both parties met Friday at the county seat to place tickets in the field.

In the Newberg district, J. M. Wright and J. J. Woods were renominated for justice of the peace and constable respectively. J. D. Crater was nominated for road supervisor in the north precinct, and L. S. Otis in the south.
