Mrs. Willie Dodge the Victim of Fatal Runaway Accident.

On Monday afternoon Mrs. Willie Dodge, accompanied by her third son, drove over to the home of her mother, Mrs. M. J. Carpenter, three miles north of town. On getting into the buggy to start home, one hind wheel of the vehicle hung up on a post to which the horse had been tied, and in lurching forward a shaft was pulled loose, which frightened the animal and caused it to run. Mrs. Dodge pulled it around in a circle, bringing the buggy into a deep ditch and throwing its occupants out. Both were badly wounded, and Dr. Littlefield was called. Though seriously injured, Mrs. Dodge was conscious, talked of the accident, and her injuries did not appear fatal. In the evening however concussion and hemorrhage of the brain developed, and after a night of suffering, though she was unconscious, she died Tuesday morning.

The tragic accident is a particularly sad one from any standpoint. After the death of Joseph Everest, first husband of the deceased, a few years ago, the widow went resolutely to work and made and maintained a home for her seven fatherless children, who are now left orphans. Mrs. Everest had been married to her present husband, Willie Dodge, but a little over three months, the marriage having occurred last May.

The funeral services were held this morning at ten o'clock, and were conducted at the cemetery by Rev. Hiram Gould.
