Lewis and Clark Centennial Notes.

"Hit the Trail" is to be the slogan of the Pacific Northwest in connection with the Lewis and Clark Centennial.

Douglas county, Oregon, has applied for exhibit space at the Lewis and Clark Centennial.

It is estimated that the attendance at the Lewis and Clark fair will be between 1,250,000 and 1,500,000.

The American Inn at the 1905 fair, which will be located on the Exposition grounds, will contain over 600 guest rooms.

A Cuban exhibit from St. Louis is on its way to Portland, where the contents will be exhibited at the 1905 fair. The car is called Cuba on Wheels.

It is probable that the Riverside, California, county irrigation display at St. Louis will be transferred and supplemented for the Lewis and Clark Exposition.

A Commercial Club has been organized at Albany, Oregon, to exploit Albany and Linn county. The club will have charge of Linn county's exhibit at the Centennial.

A Topeka Commercial Club, of Dighton, Kansas, recently adopted resolutions congratulating the people of Portland on the Lewis and Clark Centennial, and favoring participation on a large scale by the people of Kansas.

The Great Falls, Montana, Commercial Club is planning a fête to last several days, including the Fourth of July next, to celebrate the Centennial of the 1905 Exposition, as the Lewis and Clark party spent the Fourth in 1805 near Great Falls.

The project of a camping

ground to be located on the hills behind the Lewis and Clark Exposition is being agitated. Those favoring the project, argue that farmers and ranchers will want to drive to Portland during the fair and camp out, and that eastern people will enjoy the novelty of a few days of tent life.

The monster iron statue of Vulcan which was exhibited by Birmingham, Alabama, at the St. Louis fair, will be displayed at Portland next year. The statue will remain in St. Louis for four months, when it will start on its long journey to the "Rose City."

Statuary valued at \$2,600,000 is the magnificent gift of St. Louis to the Lewis and Clark Centennial. This represents the cream of the Louisiana Purchase Exposition statuary, and will add an element of beauty to the Exposition that nothing else could give.

Elaborate submarine illumination of Guild's Lake will form an unique feature of the Centennial. Guild's Lake, which is the largest body of water ever enclosed within an exposition fence, separates the mainland and the Government peninsula, and is spanned by the Bridge of Nations and the Trail, which are aggregately over 2000 feet long. Chief Engineer J. R. Thompson has planned to place rows of fifty candle-power incandescent lamps on the bottom of the lake on each side of the Bridge of Nations.

In order to provide for the best of the overwhelming array of exhibitors who wish to participate, it has been necessary to make a readjustment of the exhibit building and to provide for 30,000 square feet of additional space. This space will be added to the new exhibit palace recently provided by the executive board, so that the building will contain 90,000 feet of floor space, and equal in size the Agricultural Palace, the largest building at the Exposition. With this additional space it will be possible to provide for all exhibitors.
