The Telephone Register made some rather caustic comments last week regarding the management at the fair, charging among other things that "everybody save a favored few are fleeced on every hand when they visit the fair." The Graphic has been represented on the grounds at different times and so far the arrangements for the convenience of the public have been found to be quite as satisfactory as they were at Chicago and charges are not so high. Possibly there may be abuses that should be corrected, but since it is a self-evident fact that it costs a big pile of money to carry on such an Exposition as the Lewis and Clark Fair, the Graphic has had no reason so far for complaint of charges made and the discovery of the "fleecing" act has not been made.

McMinnville, the county seat of Yamhill, was a pretty fair sized town long before Newberg was born but the census taken this spring under the supervision of the county assessor, J. E. Hubbard, shows that at the present date McMinnville has a population inside the corporation of 1740 which is only 74 more than the count made for Newberg. With a few more families bearing twins and an occasional instance where triplets are counted, and Newberg will move up to the head of the list of towns in the county, while McMinnville will retire to the rank of second place.

Oregonians have a reputation for telling some pretty good stories respecting the country, but it takes a new man in the country to get real enthusiastic over our resources and "write 'em up." For instance a fellow from Wisconsin who is looking over the valley and who dropped off at Dundee, writes to his home paper, "The red clay hills back of the town are covered for miles with prune orchards, one of four thousand acres all bearing." Pretty fair sized orchards even for Yamhill county.

Newberg and Forest Grove have been running a neck and neck race in the matter of growth for the past few years but the census recently taken shows that we lead by forty-six. Newberg 1666 and Forest Grove 1620. In both places there are enough people who live immediately adjoining the corporation lines to make about 2000 population.
