Leaving here at seven o'clock in the evening he reached Sheridan in three hours and a half, was met there and made the rest of the seventy-five miles over the mountain roads that night, reaching his destination at five o'clock in the morning. Deplorable conditions awaited him. He found the disease in a most malignant form and with inadequate measures being taken to arrest the epidemic. In one family five children and the mother had died with other members sick. Dr. Littlefield took in a good supply of anti-toxine and with other medical aid was enabled to check the spread of the disease. He went primarily to attend Mrs. Cozie Hadley Smith, who was dangerously ill but whom he left in a satisfactory condition.
