C. F. Moore and family and Miss Dorothy Ehret arrived home Friday from their annual outing at Newport. C. F. has the beach habit in chronic form, and is classed among the incurables.

Terrell Steddom and family of Iowa, who have been making their home here for some months past left Tuesday morning to try Southern California. Accompanying them were Mr. and Mrs. Lou Hellings and Miss Rachel Steddom, recent arrivals from Iowa who had been making a short visit here.

On Monday about sixty former residents of Vermilion County, Illinois, picnicked in the J. M. Wright grove in the east part of town. The principal feature of the occasion was the sumptuous dinner and after the good things had been sampled as far as possible, it was agreed that Vermilion County women know how to cook. The afternoon was pleasantly passed in talking over the old times and comparing Illinois with Oregon, the verdict

seeming to be when all was said that "Oregon suits us best." If there were any who thought otherwise they very discreetly said nothing. All were very delightfully entertained by Miss Hoskins, of the Drake School of Oratory of Oskaloosa, Iowa, with a selection entitled "The Matrimonial Bureau." Those present from a distance were: Rebekah Hoskins and daughter, Cassius Hester, wife and children of Vermilion Grove, Illinois, Mrs. Stephen Hoskins and daughter of Iowa.

Some one at the county seat with a mania for statistics has estimated that there are two hundred people in that town over sixty years old. Different inferences might be drawn. The News Reporter figures that the fact speaks well for the health of the community and illustrates the reluctance of the inhabitants to die and leave such a favored land.

All members were present at the city council meeting Monday evening, Geo. W. Allen, who had been elected to fill the vacancy in the Second Ward caused by the resignation of Prof. F. K. Jones, taking his place with the city fathers. A committee was appointed to confer with the Oregon Handle Manufacturing Company relative to certain concessions desired by the latter. Main street property owners having petitioned the council to have their street improved similarly to First, the councilmen ordered the grade established on Main street from First to the railroad, in anticipation of such improvement. An ordinance was ordered drawn authorizing the purchase by the city of the Snider spring north of town. Claims allowed against the city—from the water fund, \$204.75; from the general fund, \$180.10; for

street improvement, \$2220.94. The council adjourned to meet on the evening of September 21st when assessments will be drawn for improvements made on First street.

Mrs. W. M. Clemenson, of Concord, Washington, visited in Newberg this week with her husband's parents, Mr. and Mrs. J. C. Clemenson. Accompanied by her sister-in-law Mrs. E. L. Evans, she went down to the city this morning to spend a few days at the fair before returning home.

Some fine samples of fruit have found their way from this vicinity to the county exhibit at the fair within the past week—principally from the Bonny View farm of Howard Walton north of town; also some splendid late Crawford peaches from the orchard of Thos. Miles, some of which measured nearly a foot in circumference.

General Crop Summary.

No precipitation of consequence occurred throughout the state during the last week and all late crops, with the exception of corn and hops, are in need of a good soaking rain. Light frost occurred Thursday morning on some of the bottom lands in Southern Oregon, but no damage resulted therefrom.

Thrashing is practically completed in Western Oregon, while east of the Cascade Mountains this work continues under favorable circumstances. The yield of both wheat and barley continues good in the Columbia and the Grand Ronde Valleys, but in the Willamette Valley and Southern Oregon, the grain yields were generally below the average.

Hops made satisfactory advancement and the crop is ready for harvesting. The vines are free of vermin and it is expected the quality will be good. Corn is doing nicely and a large crop is promised. Field onions are being pulled. Late potatoes and gardens are doing poorly owing to lack of rain.

Pears and prunes are ripe and being gathered. Pears are abundant, but prunes will average about half of a full crop. Apples are small in size and in well kept orchards an average crop will be harvested.

Stock on the ranges continue in fairly good condition; in the dairy districts cattle are losing flesh and there is a marked falling off in the milk supply.
