## City Councll Adopts Route New Water System.

an adjourned City Council held Monday even ing, important action was taken relative to installing the exten. sion to Newberg's water system The Council has heretofore been working on the general plan of establishing the reservoir on or near the Pontallier place southeast of the Snider spring which nearly a direct route as possibl was projected to Newberg, com ng into town on Main street. A new plan has come up fo iscussion recently however, and after careful consideration was nanimously adopted Monday vening. According to it the reservoir will be brought nearer o town and farther east and will probably be located on th Enos Ellis place, at an elevation orresponding to that of th traight line can be laid to tow ntering on College street, a dis ntering on College street, almos wholly along the public road doing away with complications arising from the securing of numerous rights of way.
By this plan it will be noticed that the two reservoirs will h considerably less than a mile apart. When in the course of time the present line shall hav given out the old mains can be abandoned it thought best and mains laid the-short distance new, thus giving Newberg a united system rather than two disconnected ones. With this in mind the new reservoir to be constructed will in all probablity have a capacity of at least half a million gallons. A larger pipe, something near a twelve inch, from the reservoir to town is also contemplated, the decreased from a financial stand point Having arrived at a def nderstanding and decision this important matter it is the intention of the Council to push the work as fast as possible The money obtained by the sale of bonds has arrived and is ready for use. The water committee was empowered, with City Attarney Butt, to proceed in locating and securing a reservoir site, all necessary surveys to make fications and in short to things moving.
