City Council Proceedings.

The Council met in special session Thursday night with Mayor Edwards in chair. Councilmen present—Forsyth, Harrold, Horton, Stratton, Woodward, Wilson.

The question of drainage on Meridian street from Fourth to Sixth was presented by Geo. Allen and was referred to committee on streets and public property with power to act.

A request for city water signed by property owners in the south part of town between River and Wynoski streets, was read. This brought up the important question of the amount of distributing pipe to be put in this season in connection with the new system. It will take one mile of pipe to put in the extensions necessary, and it's up to the Council to decide whether the city can stand the expense. The matter was referred to the fire and water committee for investigation as to cost, etc., to make recommendation at next meeting.

Street Commissioner Clemmens was authorized to hire teams and push the work of street improvement as specified in resolution previously passed.

A warrant was ordered drawn on the new water fund for \$1200 in favor of Contractor Lea, this being the balance due him under contract to date.

A bill for \$12.64 was allowed the Roselawn Cemetery Association for fencing put in on city property adjoining cemetery.

A resolution was passed calling for sidewalks as follows:

Along west side of Meridian in front of lot 1, block 41; lots 1 and 16, block 25, Edward's addition.

Lot 8, block 10, Deskins' 2nd addition.

Along Willamette, in front lot 9 block 20, Edward's addition.

Along Second, in front lots 5, 6, 7, 8, blk 17, H. & L. addition.

Along third, in front of lot 1, block 18, H. & L. addition.

Along Hancock, in front of lot 8, block 11, Deskins' 2nd addition.

Along Washington, in front of lot 1, block 7, Everest's addition.

Along Third, in front of lots 1 and 2, block 7, Everest's addition.

Along west side of Edwards street across Sheridan.

The council was informed that a dumping place for rubbish had been secured, and Mayor Edwards was encouraged to issue proclamation calling for general cleaning up of city.

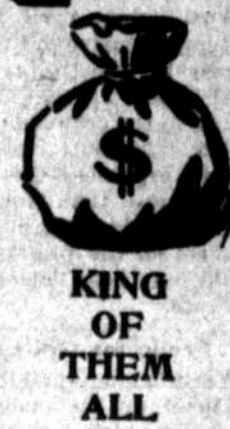
