As a county seat town, McMinnville is a credit to Yamhill County and also to the state of Oregon. The business houses are all that could be desired and the residences are neat and kept well painted.

During the past ten days honors have come easy to Editor Martin of the Telephone-Register. He was first elected president of the county press association and a few days later a new heir appeared at his home.

The officials have been telling us that the Yamhill branch was being operated at a loss to the company, but there must be a mistake in the footings somewhere.

The Walla Walla papers say the price of acreage along the line of the interurban road running from that city to Milton has doubled in price since the road has been put into operation. That has been the result all over the country wherever interurban roads have been built, and yet you will occasionally run up against a doubting Thomas who fears such a road would injure business. Swackhammer, the colored wanderer who is making the second round of the towns in the valley, posing as a lecturer and preacher, strolled into town last Saturday, dressed up with a collar and tie but minus a shirt to match. As a rule it is a pretty safe proposition to pass the fellow on who is looking for an audience, but who comes from nowhere and without credentials. Swackhammer seemed considerably incensed on account of not being given a house to speak in at Dundee.

The Graphic continues to hear of the good work done by the Lewis and Clark fair edition that was issued from this office. As a sample of the letters received from people who have seen copies of it, we quote the following from a letter received from a Portland lady of date May 15: "Recently I saw a copy of the special edition you published during the 1905 fair, giving information about Newberg. Would like to get where there is plenty of work, good schools and churches and no saloons. Kindly send recent copy of the Graphic." In the fall of 1904 the proprietor of the Graphic received two pairs of mocking birds from his brothers in Kansas, one pair of which was released on the J. L. Hoskins farm near town the following spring. They were sent about the place for several days, but later were lost sight of and their fate has since been in doubt. Morris Heacock, who is authority on birds, now brings the information that two pairs of mocking birds are nesting near town and that he hears them singing almost every day and late at night. If there is any feathered songster that pays for his feed in sweet music furnished, it is the mocking bird, and we hope these birds will remain unmolested and that they will continue to multiply and become plentiful in the valley.

Died.

Benjamin Janeway, who died at his home in Sherwood on May 18, was born in Jefferson county, Tennessee, September 17, 1838. He was married to Mary Jane Lewis, August 24, 1856, with whom he lived until his death. In the spring of 1857 they removed to Jasper county, Iowa, where they resided until 1883, when they removed to Garfield county, Washington where they took up a homestead. On account of his health not being good in this location they came to Oregon in about a year and a half, first settling at Newberg and later at Sherwood where they resided until the time of his death.

The deceased was converted to christianity when he was thirty years old and continued to be a faithful christian worker during the remainder of his life, always proclaiming the good things of God when opportunity afforded.

In his death he leaves, besides a large circle of sorrowing neighbors and friends, a widow, one son, R. E. Janeway, five daughters, Mrs. Maggie Stoops, Winterset, Iowa, Mrs. Alice Haworth, Walla Walla, Washington, Mrs. Julia Reasoner, Hillsboro, Oregon, Mrs. Amanda E. Haworth, Lents, Oregon. At the time of his death he was surrounded by his wife, his daughters, Alice and Amanda Haworth and his son-in-law, A. T. Haworth. The remains were laid to rest in the Middleton cemetery at 2:30 p. m. Sunday, May 19.

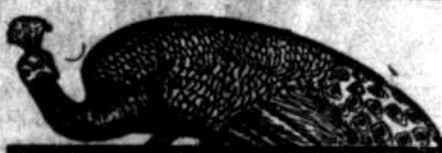
