### Bids Wanted.

Notice is hereby given that the undersigned will receive up to 1 o'clock p. m., Monday, July 20, 1908, sealed bids for making the following improvements:  
For grading all that portion of Main street between the south side of First street and the south side of railroad track in the city of Newberg.

For hauling and delivering upon said portion of Main street crushed rock, and placing the same upon said portion of said Main street from gutter to gutter, so that when completed said crushed rock shall be nine inches deep in center of street, and six inches deep at gutter and to be from center to gutter of an even and uniform depth and grade, the rock to come from the quarry below the Grafe mill on the west side of Chehalem creek; said crushed rock to be put on in three coats; first coat to be crushed to 2½ inches, second coat 1 inch and third coat screenings, each coat to be thoroughly rolled and packed. Said crushed rock to be delivered by October 1, 1908.

Said improvements shall be done in compliance with Ordinances No. 211 and 214. Separate bids will be received for said grading, and for delivering said crushed rock, and also for doing all of said work, and said bids shall state the amount per cubic yard for which he will deliver and place upon said street the said crushed rock.

The person receiving said contract or contracts will be required to enter into a written contract, and no bids will be received after the time herein specified. The right reserved to reject any and all bids; and said bids shall be enclosed in a sealed envelope and delivered to the undersigned.

### Too Many Revolvers.

Some men arrested for drunkenness and disorderly conduct, while armed with revolvers were let off the other day with fines of \$2 each, and their guns were returned to them. The Journal hopes the time will soon come when magistrates and others in authority will take a more serious view of the danger and evil of the promiscuous carrying of revolvers. Not a day passes but the news columns relate murders or murderous assaults by irresponsible people with revolvers—jealous husbands, "love"-crazed youths, men of all sorts in all stages of drunkenness, hobos and thoughtless boys. Such cases run into the thousands in this country in the course of a year, and in not one case in a thousand is a revolver any protection or does it serve any useful purpose.

The revolvers found on hobos, drunken men, boys and irresponsible people generally, should be taken from them as a partial penalty. In not one case in 100 is a revolver carried for any good purpose. It may be allowable for a man to have a revolver out in the woods, but he has no proper use for one in town. And even in the country it is the means of many sad tragedies, and little if any good.

It would be well for the country if the ownership or possession of one of these implements of mischief and crime were permitted only by special license and if the manufacture and sale of pocket guns were rigidly restricted.—Portland Journal.
