DEAR SIR: The Oregon State Horticultural Society will meet in Portland, Oregon, December first, in annual session. It will likewise introduce the sixteenth annual convention of the Fruit Growers' Association which organization will deliberate during the three following days.

This in itself will bring out a lively contest and many splendid exhibits, besides there will be several most excellent non-competitive displays from the leading orchard districts.
