Dundee Items.

The present week will bring
operations in the dryers and or-
chards about Dundee almost to a
close. Owing to the lateness of the
season, harvesting has been fol-
lowed up with more than usual
energy. Favored by the unusu-
ally fine weather of the past few
weeks, picking and drying have
gone on uninterrupted and grow-
ers have been able to save the en-
tire output of their orchards.
This is especially gratifying to
the Dundee people as the crop
has been much heavier and of
better quality than general crop
conditions would seem to justify.
Sizes run from 10 to 15 points
better than those of last season,
and on the hills above Dundee
where prune growing is carried
on most extensively the yield is
almost up to normal if not above.
Reports from the Company or-
chard indicate that the crop will
be the largest ever put through
the dryers. The bulk of the out-
put from this vicinity goes under
contract to Mason and Ehrman,
at a 2% base, which is considered
good for the season. Some large
lots remain unsold and are being
stored in the packing house at
Dundee.

The public sale on the Beryman
place to occur Oct. 12 was pulled
off before a large crowd from all
parts of the county. Values were
not as high as were in evidence a
year ago. Horses were the one
exception and were much in de-
mand. Several Newberg dealers
were at the ringside and bid well
for the best offered.
